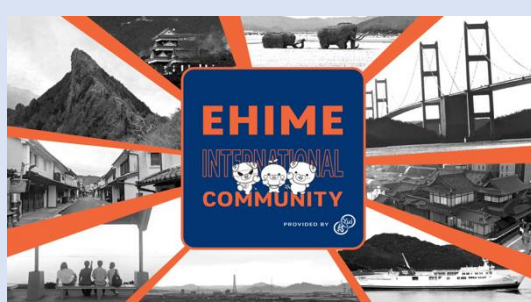


Yui Ehime YouTube Channel
